"...hope does not disappoint us, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us." Romans 5:1-5

In his letter to the Church in Rome, the Apostle Paul encouraged the members facing affliction by showing the chain reaction which produces hope: "...let us also boast in our afflictions, knowing that affliction produces endurance, and endurance produces character, and character produces hope..." (Romans 5:3-4 NRSVUE). While we continue to face afflictions in an uncertain world, further complication by the ongoing pandemic, we persevere in bringing hope and love as the living body of Christ in the world. We draw our hope from the well of God's abundant generosity, in order that we might endure and pour out God's love in our communities and beyond. I want to begin by joining with Rev. Trish in offering sincere thanks to our Wardens, lay leaders and volunteers who, to paraphrase the hymn above, are constantly faithful when they hear Christ's call. I am especially thankful as I recognize that all our ministries have been altered and often made more complex and challenging by this long period of pandemic that we are still enduring.

Thank you to Rev. Trish for so gracefully taking on the role of Incumbent of the LAM parishes, and for making it truly a joy to be in team ministry. Thank you also to Rev. Canon Reg, always ready and willing to assist.

I am delighted that we've been able to restore a regular in-person worship schedule and to have some opportunities for other in-person engagement, even as we've continued to benefit from the technology that permits us to worship, study and meet online.

One of the things that seems to have become most difficult is to have really open conversations about how things are, where God is calling us to change and grow, and what we need to do to accomplish that. I hope that the questions I raise here can be a starting point for parish-wide honest and heartfelt discussions about this.

As I review our ministry plan for 2022, I see that we have accomplished much of what we intended with regard to **Worship**. Mindful that some folks are no longer joining us in person, how do we include them? Are there ways we can better meet the needs of families and youth? How do we restore a more team-led approach to worship planning?

As we think about **Discipleship**, how can we provide resources and inspire people to engage, especially thinking of those who are not able to participate in online events? How do we

ensure regular and faithful attention to stewardship of all our time, talent and treasure? In addition to what we planned, can we commit to continuing engagement with truth and reconciliation?

Pondering our **Ministry**, what are the local and global needs we most want to attend to, and how do we best do that? What further actions do we need to take to champion inclusiveness?

Recognizing how challenging it has been to have the regular **Fellowship** events we've been used to, what are the types of gathering we really need to put our energy into? Is there some other avenue for fellowship that we're invited to?

Looking out in **Mission** from the local to the global, what are we truly passionate about supporting, and how do we accomplish that? What strategies can we use to make ourselves better known in our own community so people will know we are here to serve?

Giving thanks for our **Resources**, how do we make sure that all our members know both what we have and what we need? How do we assess what resources we need to grow, and what resources are no longer needed for our ministry and mission? How do we best resource our ministry with care for creation in mind?

I encourage you to think of this period of pandemic as a sort of fallow time. Such a time is not meant to continue indefinitely, but to be followed by well planned sowing, tending and harvesting, and the planning needs to be open to considering whether we would best serve God by continuing in our usual patterns, returning to practices that we've set aside, or trying something entirely new in this part of God's mission field. Let's bring both our questions and our prayerful answers together to plan both our short-term and long-term future, and 'may the God of hope go with us every day'!
